Here's where to put up out-of-town guests

KOREATOWN

None of that trendy industrial-chic stuff at the Hotel Normandie (doubles from \$234). Close to downtown, this dignified 1920s apartment building turned hotel has 91 rooms decorated in clubby simplicity. Bonus: It's dog-friendly.

BEVERLY HILLS

Located on a quiet residential street, the 49-room Mosaic Hotel (doubles from \$331) is newly renovated, with sleek and subdued contemporary furniture accented by bright contemporary artwork. Little pampering touches include free Wi-Fi, Nespresso machines and rainfall showerheads.

WEST HOLLYWOOD

Philippe Starck's colorful decor and tiny rooms make this sort of like the Ace squished into a Crayola box.

Gene Autry's former estate has been turned into The Garland (doubles from \$239), a quaint family resort with a '70s-era color scheme (think orange patterned curtains and brown carpeting), a trolley to Universal Studios and tai chi on the lawn.

LOS FELIZ

Hidden up a flight of stairs just next to a slice-of-Paris wine bar, the Hotel Covell (doubles from \$239) is a set of 6 suites that seem more like chic apartments than inn rooms. While the narrow stairwell and no-check-in desk require a certain amount of self-sufficiency, the groovy midcentury-modern antiques and proximity to Silverlake more than
